

West Worthing Baptist Church



The audio and loop system at West Worthing Baptist Church finally gave up and the Church committee appointed Sound Advice Ltd. to design and install a new audio visual system.

A new 2.5 metre electronic screen was set across one of the corners at an angle to allow everyone in the congregation to get a clear view of the images and using a 4,500 ANSI lumen digital projector, the images are bright and crisp, even in daylight as can be seen in the photo.

There is a plug in point at the lectern for a laptop and a second at the rear located in the equipment cabinet to enable DVD's to be played. There is also a monitor on the organ allowing the organist to see the images clearly. All of the video connections were done using CAT 5 data cable to minimise the cabling impact and ensure strong signals without any loss.

There are just two professional line array loudspeakers, one to the right of the screen and the other mirrored on the window reveal on the left, that provide highly intelligible speech throughout the space. They are also excellent for playback of recorded music from DVD's and CD's etc. Input to the loudspeakers is from a stereo power amplifier with graphic equalisers, four radio microphones, a lectern microphone and an ambient microphone, all of which are mixed and sent to the new loop induction system for the hard of hearing.

A digital recorder is installed in the equipment rack that records the whole service to enable CD's to be produced for members of the congregation who cannot attend the service.
